In spite of the London Mayor's determination to expand the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) to outer London, a number of councils, including Bromley, continue to resist.



## **Waitrose Bromley South Development**

Waitrose have been running a consultation on their plans to develop the Bromley South site. Their vision is "to improve the existing Waitrose store, public realm and pedestrian experience whilst delivering high-quality, energy-efficient build-to-rent homes in a sustainable and well-connected location." The latest round of consultation ends on 9th February but it is likely there will be further opportunity to comment before the plans are finalised.

## **London Open City**

Open City is dedicated to making the urban landscape more open, accessible and equitable. This includes a weekly show, The Londown, which features news and analysis covering the big issues in London's built environment, and longer form shows breaking down big issues connecting architecture and politics with in-depth interviews.

The show is hosted by a roster of rising stars in architectural criticism, planning and public engagement, and features interviews and discussions with leading experts from across architecture and design, as well as artists, academics, policy makers and journalists.

Since our last newsletter, our efforts to block what we believe to be inappropriate planning applications have had the following successes:

**66 Madeira Avenue** - The application to reduce the height of the tulip tree by 6 metres was refused, although permission was granted to reduce it by 3 metres. Details <a href="here.">here.</a>

There is an extensive range of activities and events planned in the park and the Mansion.


