A quick thankyou

We would like to say a quick thankyou for the support of local Councillors who amongst other things have helped with the Shortlands Village Conservation Area, some problems in Farnaby Road and the planning application for Billingford in Elstree Hill. We have also appreciated the help of Cllr Alexa Michael, Chair of Bromley's Development Control Committee, who has helped with some planning situations where developers have not built in accordance with permitted plans. In particular Cllr Michael supported residents to insist that the developer of Matilda House in Hillbrow Road plant the trees they promised to screen the intrusive new block of flats.

Bromley Town Centre

In January 2021, an application was submitted relating to the pedestrianised area of Bromley High Street: details <u>here</u>

The application summary is for: "Installation of open air performance area and seating with canopy and sculptural interactive artworks; Bench with drinking water fountain; and 'Time Machine'".

Bromley Civic Society (BCS) was invited as a stakeholder to work with the urban designers on this project and although they fully endorsed the principle of an initiative of this kind in the Town Centre, they had serious concerns about how it had developed. Due to BCS's report and other objections, the application has been withdrawn but it is anticipated that a modified proposal will follow.

Ravensbourne Station

We are expecting a large mural to be painted on the bare wall at the station any time soon, together with large planters by the ramp on Platform 2.

Parking in Ravensbourne Avenue, unmade section

What's happening regarding parking on the unmade stretch of Ravensbourne Avenue? We understand that, at the moment, discussions are continuing between the charity landowner (Phoenix Community Housing) and LB Bromley as to what is permissible in terms of controlling parking.



Parking in the unmade section only really started when LB Bromley started charging for parking in Crab Hill and then increased further when Beckenham Place Park reopened. We have been advised that this is causing considerable difficulties for residents. For example, all the extra use has been wearing the road out (literally!), causing costs to the owner and residents running into tens of thousands of pounds. Inconsiderate parking has also been blocking residents' driveways and has obstructed emergency vehicle access.


More positively, we have been advised that the landowner and the residents wish to develop a vision of a green corridor to the park, safe for walking and cycling, with a minimum of environmentally damaging vehicle movements.

It is these issues which have prompted the possibility of changes to the parking arrangements.

In the meantime, while we wait for a resolution, please use "green" methods of transport whenever possible. Where this is not possible, please park thoughtfully - there are often spaces in Crab Hill which are either always free or free of charge at certain times.

Air Pollution

Air pollution is again in the news with a Coroner ruling that it materially contributed to the death of a 9 year old child in South London. In addition the matter was discussed in parliament recently. Smoke contains tiny particles (PM2.5) which enter the body and can do serious harm. Please burn wood (and other things) thoughtfully.

Beckenham Place Park

Events and activities in the park and at the Mansion House are gradually resuming.

Here is an overview of what is planned:

Mansion House

- The basement café is re-opening from 17th May;
- Sewing classes re-start on 19th May;
- The street food market will re-start on 27th May, every Thursday and some Fridays;
- Other classes will also restart soon, including:
 - Pre-natal and Post-natal Yoga;
 - Yoga and Pilates;
 - Arts and Crafts:

Park

- Toilets in the Homestead courtyard are open daily 9.30am-8pm;
- The <u>Homestead Café</u> and bar will fully re-open on 17th May;
- The car park now operates a pay and display system and there are other restrictions around parking inside the park. But please walk or cycle!;
- The lake is open for swimming and paddle boarding. Sessions must be pre-booked. See here for booking information;
- A series of photography competitions is taking place with three categories still open for entries, viz: Spring, Summer and Autumn;
- The annual flower and dog show was scheduled for Sunday 1st August but it appears it may have moved online. Unfortunately the information link on Lewisham website is broken.

Planning Applications

A further attempt to develop the Billingford site has been submitted. We have objected to the proposals and further details are on our website <u>here</u>.

76A&B The Avenue – awaiting outcome of application to replace houses with block of flats. **8 Madeira Avenue** – application refused.

70 High Street - original application refused. No further update.

2A Downs Hill – car port subject to enforcement. LBB investigating building in garden.

26 *Hillbrow Road* – appeal dismissed and a second application withdrawn.


During lockdown, a number of residents have been catching up with building projects. Unfortunately some of these have fallen foul of Bromley's planning policies meaning that the Council has required some structures to be removed, altered or demolished. Please ensure that you have or don't need permission for even the smallest building work. For example, even decking over 30cm high or a fence over 1m high may need planning permission.

Roads and Traffic

Traffic Management

The traffic management on Albemarle Road and Westgate Road is changing again. In summary, the changes will revert Albemarle Road to two directional traffic between Westgate Road and Beckenham High Street and continue to have one directional traffic, south bound over Westgate Road bridge. These changes will be made under the existing experimental traffic order.

E-Scooters

Just don't! Or at least be aware of the downsides! Fines for use on the pavement or road include:

- a Fixed Penalty Notice for no insurance, with a £300 fine and six penalty points;
- a Fixed Penalty Notice for no driving licence, up to £100 fine and three-six penalty points;
- and the e-scooter could be seized. In reality, the bigger penalty might be substantially increased car insurance premiums. More Police advice here.
